

PROSPECTIVE NEW MEETING PLACE

For a couple of years now, the Porirua church has been saying how much we think the work in Porirua could benefit from having a permanent place to call our own. We have been renting out a school hall for two hours a week for the last six years. Some new rules at the school have made it more difficult for some people to attend worship and have made it less desirable for visitors to come. Because of that, we decided it was time to really crunch the numbers and see about a new place to meet. We have made an offer to lease a building not far from the school we rent from. The realtor has told us that he's sure we will have the place to ourselves by 14 September. There are still a few factors "up in the air," but we are proceeding with faith that we will begin meeting there on 17 September. We are very excited about what we will be able to do with this building. Pray that God uses it through His people for His glory!

SONNY

TECHNOLOGY FOR CHRISTIANS COURSE

Speaking of technology, I am currently teaching a course in Bear Valley called *Technology For Christians*. The students seem to be enjoying it, and I certainly am. We are learning how to keep data safe, how to use Bible apps to their full potential, how to use technology in the public and private teaching of God's word, how to build basic websites, and how to use social media for evangelism.

TEACHING IN NAPIER

It is turning into a tradition for our family that we make the four-hour trip to Napier about this time each year. We have now made that trip three years in a row. The brethren there have always been gracious to us, and we have enjoyed our time with them. I preached on Matthew 5:21-26, and I taught a class on "Weaknesses In the Body of Christ."

MEN'S CHALLENGE

For the first time, I was able to attend Men's Challenge this year. It takes place in Rotorua each year, which is about six hours from Porirua. They were celebrating thirty years of Men's Challenges, and they showed photos from the previous years. It was great seeing the men that I look up to now faithfully attending and teaching back then. They have much less or much whiter hair now (Prov. 16:31).

Leading up to the Men's Challenge, I also attended the Leadership Forum. During the Forum, we studied the letters to the seven churches of Asia in Revelation 2-3. In the Challenge, we studied Back To the Word in Prayer, Boldness, and Maturity. There were about 30 in attendance at the Forum, and about 60 at the Challenge.

STUDIO LESSONS

I have had two guest speakers in my video studio (a.k.a. our garage) in the past month. Rod Kyle spoke on the "Silence of the Scriptures: Permissive or Restrictive?" If the Lord wills, the Porirua church will have a new meeting place starting in mid-September. For the past six years, the church has been renting a school hall for two hours a week. If this works out, we will have access to a building 24/7. In addition to all of the evangelistic and edification opportunities this building will open up for the Porirua church, we will also plan to use the building as a new BVBINZ hub, rather than having it in Wellington CBD. It will be a much closer commute to 90% of the students and 100% of the New Zealand instructors.
